3. President's Report (Rick Martinson)

Ongoing Projects completed in 2024:

- Prevost trail sanctioning
- Double D refresh machine built
- Trail user survey (launched Fall 2023; presentations ongoing)

New Initiatives:

- \$68,000 donation from Shimano Trail Born to support Jackson Goldstone film project on Prevost plus additional trail work
- Prevost Combine: A new initiative targeting youth aspiring to become professional riders
- Prevost Advisory Group: Formed to ensure the trail community guides maintenance work
- Documentation of trail history: focusing on the origins, naming, and development of the trail networks
- Historical record of CTSS formation and development

Acknowledgments & Contributions:

- \$5,000 donation by Hatton Insurance of their brokerage award.
- Jason Hatton \$1,000 donation from celebrity chef pizza fundraiser
- Matthuw Ronald-Jones \$2500 donation matching campaign for Double D
- Cal Kaiser \$1500 sponsorship of November Beef & Beer Fundraiser
- Steve Garnett cedar donation
- Mark Wallace milled cedar and FireSmart fir
- North Cowichan FireSmart fir contribution
- Over \$20,000 from charitable donations from individual supporters including a donor who contributes through payroll deductions from work.

Volunteer & Staff Contributions:

- Over 8,000 hours of work (volunteer + paid staff)
- Volunteer work was worth over \$100,000 if it was paid work.

4. Financial Report (Mike Evans)

- \$37,000 overall increase in revenues for 2024 over 2023. Own-source revenue increased \$55,000 while the flow-through of grants from North Cowichan decreased by \$44,000 (related to completion of Prevost sanctioning)
- \$2,400 operating deficit for 2024

5. Trail Operations Report

Prevost Projects:

- The Ritz received significant upgrades to accommodate Jackson Goldstone filming
- Free Radicals dig day on Prevost (Bubonic and Mr. T)
- April Dig Day on Patchworks, Ritz and Threat Level Midnight sponsored by Miranda Miller of Sram.
- Race Trail completed by volunteers

Tzouhalem Projects:

- Double D refresh with both paid and volunteer labour and machine time
- Garry and Roy are the Tzou volunteer trail crew. They maintain a number of trails and report to Brendan
- Awesome Trail maintenance
- Skinny added on Tzou Mainline

Maple Mountain Projects:

- Cleanup of Tony Arbutus
- Broom removal on South View
- Dirt capping on *Upper Maple Syrup*
- Rainbow bridge replaced on Lower Maple Syrup

Equipment:

• Purchase of mini excavator by Brendan (owned by Brendan, not CTSS)

6. Report from the Municipality of North Cowichan (Neil Pukush)

Voiced support for CTSS initiatives

Forestry Review:

- North Cowichan is moving toward co-management with Quw'utsun Nations. This is unique in BC as it does not involve Crown land.
- Proponent has been selected from proposal call (announcement pending)

- Estimated duration: 18–24 months
- New sanctioned trails will not be permitted until co-management framework completion
- Public updates will be shared, though no formal engagement process planned
- FireSmart work is currently paused until fall

Additional Updates:

- ~152 signs missing from Tzou; estimated cost to replace is \$1,600 plus labour.
- North Cowichan is getting positive public feedback on the Tzouhalem boardwalk it is very much appreciated
- Firehall Trails: kiosk and signage pending; trail naming in collaboration with Quw'utsun Nations

7. Questions from members

Pump Track:

- Proposed location: Sportsplex property at Beverly and Lakes Rd
- Sportsplex board is supportive
- Velosolutions provided a preliminary cost estimate (non-specific)
- Next steps:
 - 1. Delegation to North Cowichan to secure land use
 - 2. Return to CTSS for fundraising efforts
- Target: have planning completed by Fall
- Neil Pukesh expressed interest but noted financial constraints will be the largest hurdle

Fuller Lake Arena Trails:

• A championship-level disc golf course is being installed and no plans to develop trails

Mount Richards

 Trails fall under the new co-management plan and are not eligible for sanctioning until that is completed and the Parks & Trails Masterplan is revisited.

FireSmart:

• Why is the top of Maple Mountain targeted for FireSmart work? – answer pending
